#### Introducing our not so 'Tiny Table'

The 'Tiny Table', which we like to call the *Magic Table* is another addition to St. Bernards. The interactive large tablet allows residents to take advantage to an array of digital activities. The likes of chess, crosswords and many more applications are integrated on the tablet allowing residents to join group activities as well as solo.

The Tiny Table was introduced in November as it caters for all residents regardless of their ability. Dementia patients have unique applications installed that trigger stimulation and dexterity, allowing them to be as much involved in St. Bernards activities as the next resident.
